

President's report

Welcome to the first 2008 newsletter for the Taroona Community Association and a warm welcome to any new residents.

The Australian Government has heralded 2008 with a timely and historic apology to our indigenous community's stolen generation. Past actions resulted in considerable damage to Tasmania's Aboriginal community. This apology symbolises an important beginning in Australia's indigenous politics.

Some news on Taroona activities and issues.....

In December, along with a large number of concerned residents, the TCA lodged an objection to a planning application to demolish 3 houses and construct 45 independent living units at 28, 30, 32 and 34 Channel Highway neighbouring Mary's Grange complex. The plans presented nine large building complexes; four of which would be up to four storeys in height.

In the TCA's representation to the Council, it was highlighted that our group is not opposed to a proposal for clustered housing to cater for our aging population in this area. However, we are concerned about the density and scale of this development and its lack of appreciation of the site and the inherent character of Taroona. To see TCA's representation please contact me.

The Taroona Neighbourhood Garden is flourishing. Many of the already established garden beds are verdant with maturing vegetables. The TCA supports this wonderful, community-based, environmentally sustainable project. It is still early days and there is considerable work yet to be done in establishing the garden beds, planting fruit trees, and funding and constructing a fence. Residents are invited to a community open day on Sunday,16 March to learn more about the garden. See over page for more.

Over the next 5 months residents who walk the Taroona foreshore will notice an enthusiastic group of young people undertaking weeding and revegetation works at sites extending from Melinga Place through to Hinsby Beach, and further north in Truganini Reserve. This group is from Green Corps and is supported by Kingborough Council, Taroona Environment Network and Friends of Truganini Reserve Bushcare Group. Please make them feel welcome!

During February, April and July, you might spot a khakiclad team of workers along our foreshore. This is a Green Corps team. Green Corps is a national organisation dedicated to skilling unemployed young people in environmental activities. Kingborough Council, TEN and Friends of Truganini Bushcare Group were successful in securing the labour force of a Green Corps team to conduct environmental work in Taroona. They will be involved in seed collection, weeding and planting, with their work overseen by a qualified Green Corps team leader. If you see them out on the track, encourage them and thank them for their contribution.

The Taroona Neighbourhood Garden from little things big things grow!

Have you ever wondered why your garden seems to grow weeds better than vegies? Or perhaps you'd like to know how to handle pests without spraying chemicals or how to grow vegies organically?

The Taroona Neighbourhood Garden (TNG) can help. The TNG aims to provide a sunny open space for local residents and students to learn organic gardening skills, exchange gardening ideas and gain good nutritious food; plus get some healthy outdoor exercise. We are establishing the garden along permaculture principles and making beds available to community members as well as to educational groups including Possums Playcentre, and Taroona Primary and Secondary schools.

We hope in to develop a series of thriving vegie patches, fruit trees interwined with the perimeter fence and a mini market garden where Taroona residents can purchase organic food at low cost.

People occasionally ask why have a community garden when we could grow vegies in our backyards? Well we could, but for many it's more enjoyable in a group where you can swap ideas (and the inevitable extra zucchinis). But there's also the added attraction of learning from one of Tasmania's foremost organic gardening gurus. David Stephen, a long term Taroona resident, is well known for his organic gardening calendars and Adult Education classes.

David is a driving force behind the garden and a wellspring of knowledge for the TNG - though even he has expressed surprise at how well some of the sweetcorn has grown!



Since October last year we have developed 15 raised garden beds (using cliplock steel panels with recycled timber returns) and have started planting the community market garden (a double size bed). There is still a long way to go and any assistance / donations are welcome.

Special thanks to *Fair Dinkum Homes and Sheds* who generously donated a shed, we can now tidy up the site and keep equipment dry.

Compost-Making 'Apprenticeships'

Now available at the Taroona Neighboroughhood Garden (TNG)

WANTED: Up to 10 students, aged 16-60 years of age, to attend 4 weekend workshops during Autumn to learn th fundamentals of waste recycling. TNG is gearing up for a major focus on composting - making a soil improver from organic residues. The mature product will be sold at an affordable price to support local vegetable gardens in Taroona.

Graduates of this hands-on course will get ongoing practical experience at the TNG and eventually be proficient enough to teach others their skills.

A small cost is involved to cover materials.

David has been teaching organiculture since 1973 and is consultant to the School and Community Garden Network.

Compost Making Training Program

First Workshop: The role of earthworms in vermicomposting: active and passive methods explained (to turn or not to turn?); kitchen scrap composting - why is it so difficult?

Second Workshop: Converting stable residues into compost or feeding mulch. How to make good use of organic manures. Understanding the carbon/nitrogen ratio.

Third Workshop: The use of activators and probiotics. Good quality compost: how to value add. The best aerobic and anaerobic methods. Could compost replace fertilisers in all situations?

Fourth Workshop: What are green manures all about? Three methods for converting spent crop residues. 14 day compost demonstrated, using pine needles, gum leaves and green waste.
