#### Dr Lawrence retires

#### Taroona businesses

Since the closure of the shopping centre supermarket last year Joe Ritz at the Taroona Service Station has played an important role in providing groceries and other supplies for sale. Unfortunately, due to ill health, Joe has been forced to close his business. The TCA wishes him well and thanks him for his generosity and good will. Hugh Nally is to continue his motor mechanics service centre, and has stated that there has been interest from prospective lessees to continue to run a small shop at this location.

There is little news of any developments at the shopping centre, other than the For Bread commercial bakery is closing to move to a bigger facility. The commercial laundry and Taroona Community Library are the only facilities remaining in the shopping centre. I encourage residents to drop into the Community Library on a Monday, Tuesday, Friday or Saturday to peruse their great book collection or just say a cheery hello.

It is great to see progress being made on the redevelopment of the Taroona Hotel. It is expected that Stage 1 works will be completed in March-April 2008, with Stages 2 and 3 to follow.

#### Council proposal to sell off public land

Residents may recall receiving a letter from Council in October regarding Council's resolution to dispose of seven areas of public open space in Taroona, Taronga and Bonnet Hill. TCA lodged a submission with Kingborough Council outlining objections to the disposal of land in Delta Avenue, Wooten Drive, Bonnet Hill, and Coolamon Road. We requested clarification on the Sedgebrook Road Reserve and that Council implement legal mechanisms to protect riparian habitat values before selling lands at Channel Highway and Glenn Albyn Creek.

Kingborough Council and Green Corps have also been successful in submitting a joint application for funding which means that TEN will benefit from a Green Corp team working on some of our sites throughout the year.

This has been, and will continue to be, a busy period for the club celebrating its 60th anniversary. At the Taroona War Memorial on the 11th November about forty people attended the Remembrance Day Service conducted by club President Denis Suckling and Rev. Erma Briggs.

On 20th November Kingborough Mayor Dr Graham Bury, launched the club's history 'Services Rendered, The Taroona Ex-Services Club and its Members by John McMahon.

Services Rendered records the sixty year history of the club, and also relates the exploits of many of the club's 445 or more members. Their story is a fascinating saga of individuals who served in defence of their country, from World War I to the Gulf War. It also records members' peace time contributions to the club and Taroona community.
