## **Foreshore Walking Track Update**

The Kingborough Council at its April meeting considered two reports regarding the Taroona Foreshore Walking Track and the issue of the unresolved titles along the foreshore walking track extending between Seaview Avenue and Melinga Place. It was resolved "that Council progressively undertake the upgrading of the Taroona foreshore walking track from Melinga Place through to Kelvedon Oval as land access becomes available."

The public report outlined the legal status of all land titles in this area, and it is understood that legal public access to most of these areas is to be resolved. However this notably excludes the area that contains the pathway that extends from the end of Seaview Avenue and the adjacent foreshore including the rocky beach. The legal advice stated that this area is not owned by the Council, but that the community (not Council) has legal rights of access to this land due to long term recreational access of the area. The TCA is also aware that many Seaview Avenue titles show a benefitting easement with a Right of Carriageway over the parcel extending from the end of Seaview to the foreshore land . This allows them (and others) access to the foreshore.

Meanwhile, the Council has programmed to upgrade and construct a new walking north from the Sewage Treatment Plant commencing later in the year. The works will include upgrading the current track and constructing a new route around the base of the Kelvedon Oval and between Flinders Esplanade and Nubeena Crescent

# Tasmanian Heritage Festival 'Open Doors' event at Taroona church

St Pius X Catholic Church, Taroona was one of twelve historic sites chosen to participate in this year's Tasmanian Heritage Festival "Open Doors" event held on 29 and 30 May.

The Church located at 100 Channel Highway is renowned for its distinctive architecture and is accepted as the first modernist church in Australia.

The church was designed by the famous architect, J. Esmond Dorney and built by Frank Ingram in 1957. Due to its unique and innovative design features the church is regarded as one of the treasures of our 20th century building heritage in Tasmania and is listed on the Register of the National Estate.

Over the weekend, many visitors participated in guided tours of the church conducted by Paddy Dorney, (BA Env Des, B Arch), son of the late J. Esmond Dorney. We were also privileged to have Mr Frank Ingram, the Builder of the church participate in the event.

Father Michael Tate, Parish Priest for Sandy Bay & Taroona was very pleased with the level of public interest and thanked everyone involved in making the event such a success.
