New Channel Highway fences

Concerns have been raised by residents about the visual impact of the new footpath fences erected along sections of the Channel Highway. We welcome the Council's program upgrading footpaths in Taroona's street network, but it seems to be coming with unforeseen added extras. As the new footpaths are being constructed in accordance with standards, the increased width is creating additional height to the fall on the downhill slope of the new paths resulting in the construction of rather large and unsightly fences.

Taroona is not Kingston, where similar fences are commonplace along the highway interface with the shopping centre. The tall aluminium fences are giving a "cattle run" feel to the renowned leafy suburban character of Taroona.

A foot friendly suburb... encouraging pedestrian links through Taroona

The TCA supports and encourages the establishment and formalisation of a broad network of pedestrian links through our beautiful suburb. There are a range of footways that were allocated during the historic subdivision of lower highway streets, that allow residents to walk from northern to southern Taroona. These pathways make our suburb accessible and easier for families, adults and children to get around by foot to visit the park, friends, get to highway bus stops, shops, or get to school.

There are some gaps in the network. Residents in the Wandella Avenue area have been encouraging the Council to formalise the establishment of a pedestrian link extending over private land from Wandella through to Illawong Crescent. The TCA supports this proposal and is working with the local residents to facilitate the formalisation of this link.

Kingborough Council has released for public comment a new draft Kingborough planning scheme.


Attend a public information session at the Taroona Community Hall at 7pm on Tuesday 13 November 2012.

The Taroona Book to go Online

Taroona 1808-1986 Farmlands to a garden suburb, was published 1988 by the Taroona Historical Group. This valuable reference on the history of Taroona has been out of print for many years and print copies are difficult to source. The Taroona Historical Group has long since disbanded and the book is never likely to go to a second print edition.



There is a project underway to make this significant information about the history of our suburb available to a wider audience. The Taroona Book Project plans to digitise the book and put it online on our community website at **http://taroona.tas.au**

Currently the State Library is digitising many historical records and out of print books about Tasmania, such as convict records and gazettes, but our Taroona Book is not on their list. Our Taroona Book project will make the valuable and interesting content, and the research and writing of the many local contributors, available to anyone searching 'Taroona' on the internet.

The electronic version of the book content will be made freely available online without charge and without advertising. The digital edition will be an exact image of the original printed pages.

The Taroona Community Association is supporting the project and the work of digitising will be done voluntarily.Several articles originally prepared for the book were not included, and if the authors still have that material these could also be published online as part of the project.
