Business Arising & General Business:

1. Huntingfield land release project and proposal to join [Planning Matters Alliance Tasmania](https://huntingfield.mysocialpinpoint.com/huntingfield-master-plan/) (PMAT) – The housing development at Huntingfield is moving to approve very quickly and not going through council. Information is online only (<https://huntingfield.mysocialpinpoint.com/huntingfield-master-plan/>). Jill asked the committee to review the draft Master Plan and proposed the TCA make a submission. Jill acknowledged the need for affordable housing but argued there are legitimate concerns such as housing density and transparency of process including third-party objection process. Jill proposed we join the PMAT which she described as a rigorous organisation that has done a lot of work around the new planning scheme that is being introduced. Seconded by Anne, carried.
2. Louise Hinsby Reserve – as previously discussed, Sarah Bury asked to work up a plan for Louise Hinsby Reserve during her permaculture course. Fi and Anne met with Sarah and passed on the various feedback and information we have on the reserve. See Sarah's plan attached. Fi and Anne will put a small note together to update the community.
3. Tarooma High School Association report – Fi has not heard from the THSA
4. Tarooma Walking Map update – Liz has the beginnings of a map (A3). Need to carefully check any tracks we document & discuss with Su Sprott, Recreation Officer with council. Applying for a grant would allow professional printing, Fi and Liz will work up a grant application.

5. Taroona Hwy Reserve Municipal Boundary – noting the grassed area near Ozus café caravan is getting worn with increased informal use. Possible consideration for any development in the future
6. Newsletter – Deliver weekend of 27 June. Content includes ANZAC Day, shot tower 150-year anniversary with pic of Taroona -Rosie McKean plus sketches
7. Hall & Cottage re-opening 15 June, propose we meet 18 June in the Bowls Club
8. Mountain bike usage in local parks,

Taroona Neighbourhood Garden got a \$4000 grant from Kingborough Council allocated from waste management innovation budget to purchase a custom made worm farm which will open to the community to deliver vegetable waste.
