Just a hint of warmth in the air and the occasional bit of sunshine after months of rain brings a surge of energy prompting action – whether it is in the garden, spring cleaning our homes or simply enjoying the outdoors. In Taroona there is a considerable amount of spring activity underway and much to report to you.

#### **Local Government elections**

Local Government elections are nearing. Registered voters will soon be receiving in the mail Kingborough Council candidate information and ballot papers with polling from 13-27 October. For the first time in many years a Taroona resident has nominated as a candidate. We wish Shelagh Curtain well in her endeavours to represent the concerns of Taroona in Kingborough Council.

To assist with making your voting selection in the Kingborough Council elections, the TCA invites residents to "Meet the Candidates" on Thursday, 15 October at the Taroona Community Hall. There are a range of ongoing local issues that are of particular concern to the TCA which we will be asking candidates to consider. These include:

- improving pedestrian safety on the Channel Highway (yes. . . it still remains unresolved by the Council but primarily DIER!);
- the completion of the Alum Cliffs track; and
- the formalisation and upgrading of the Taroona Foreshore Track extending from Kelvedon Oval to Melinga Place.

#### Foreshore walking track

The TCA congratulates the Council for the recently completed upgrade of the Crayfish Point. It has improved the amenity of the area enormously. But you may wonder why the Crayfish Point track upgrade works did not continue through to the High School. It has come to our attention that over recent years Council has discovered that sections of the foreshore that were previously identified as Council reserve technically still remain in private ownership by the descendants of three original landowners. When these historic titles were subdivided over 50 years ago into the lots we have today, a clerk error resulted in the foreshore strip

This track has been traversed by the public for many decades with up to 300 people walking it daily. The TCA is calling for the area to be rightly dedicated as public land, as has clearly been its historic intent, and promptly upgrade the badly deteriorated track.
