8A	<b>LIE</b>	Believe middle part is not true.. (3)  (be)LIE(ve)
9A	<b>TAROONA</b>	A marsupial inside ant, ascending popular suburb (7)  ANT backwards, around A ROO
10A	<b>SWAP</b>	see 1ac
13A	<b>TWINED</b>	Drank after the head wrapped around (6)  T(he) WINED
16A	<b>TENNIS</b>	Half a dozen start intensively, arranged this racquet sport (6)  Anagram of first six letters of INTENS(ively)

23A	<b>DERWENT</b>	Turbulent Deb won't rate, without boat for Tasmanian river (7)  Anagram: DEB WONT RATE, minus BOAT
24A	<b>TIC</b>	Core of the article referred to a twitch (3)  (ar)TIC(le)
25A	<b>BOWLO</b>	Rainbow logically includes a Taroona sports club (5)  (rain)BOW LO(gically)
26A	<b>SHOT</b>	A local tower is quietly Old Testament (4)  Quietly = SH SH + OT
1D	<b>CALMS</b>	The last part of mystical manuscript soothes (5)  (mysti)CAL + MS
2D	<b>OPERA</b>	A Repo reverses up for a dramatic musical performance (5)  A REPO reversed
4D	<b>ARROW</b>	Thin, losing head, yet thin with a head? (5)  (n)ARROW
5D	<b>THORN</b>	Spike short core in empty tin (5)

6D	<b>UTE</b>	Work vehicle at end of chute (3)  (ch)UTE
7D	<b>SAND</b>	End of parks and beach material (4)  (park)S AND
11D	<b>WEE</b>	It's tiny! Corresponding to a short week (3)  WEE(k)
12D	<b>PUN</b>	Punishment without men, this joke (3)  PUN(ishment) (ie PUNISHMENT without letters in MEN THIS)
14D	<b>IGA</b>	Local store trimmed cigar (1,1,1)  (c) IGA (r)
15D	<b>EAR</b>	Tear top off sensory organ (3)  (t) EAR
16D	<b>TIDE</b>	Sounds all wrapped up in the regular ocean cycle (4)  Homophone: TIDE sounds like TIED
17D	<b>NARCO</b>	Drug enforcement officer has night chore organised without the highs (5)  Anagram: HAS NIGHT CHORE minus letters from THE HIGHS
18D	<b>IDEAL</b>	Casino worker may say this, meaning perfection (5)  Double definition. Sounds like "I DEAL"
20D	<b>WATCH</b>	Catch swapping heads with western timepiece (5)  (c)ATCH changing the starting letter to W from W(estern)
21D	<b>YACHT</b>	Vessel hidden up in the North Cayman's (5)  (nor)TH CAY (man's) reversed
22D	<b>ATE</b>	Did dine, though sounds like after 7pm (3)  Homophone: ATE sounds like EIGHT
